

Test question elements

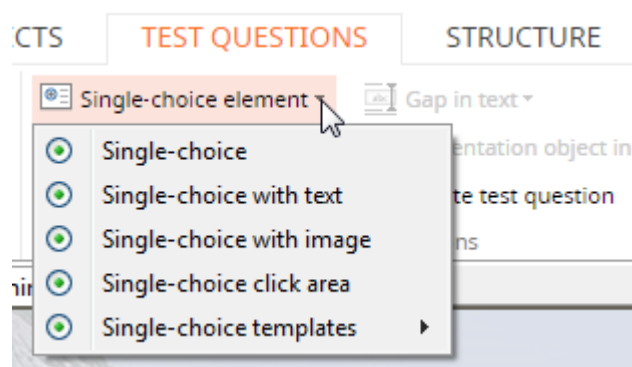
This documentation will demonstrate how to insert individual test questions (instead of inserting them via templates) in the Document Editor and how to separate single-choice and multiple-choice elements from one another.

1 Which test questions are available?

In the event that the default templates are not 100% suitable for your project needs, you can create your own test questions independently. This can be done with the help of the **Create test questions** function group on the **Test Questions** tab.

The only difference between the **single-choice** and **multiple-choice** types of questions is that one or several potential answers can be defined as the correct answer.

No matter whether you want to compile a single-choice or a multiple-choice question, you can always choose between five different types of creation procedure. The selection menu can be accessed by clicking the black dropdown arrow for the respective type of question.



Single-choice / Multiple-choice

If this option is selected, only the appropriate symbol for the type of question will be inserted into the e-learning page.

Single-choice / Multiple-choice with text

If this option is selected, the corresponding symbol, along with a text field for typing in the appropriate answer text, will be inserted into the page (as an object template).

Single-choice / Multiple-choice with image


When this option is chosen, you also need to select the appropriate image for insertion. The image will then be displayed next to the appropriate radiobutton/checkbox in the e-learning (as an object template).

Single-choice / Multiple-choice click area

This option allows you to specify a click area as the answer. This area is a transparent object which has a black frame that is 1-pixel wide when inserted (by default). If necessary, it's possible to adapt the appearance of the click area when selecting and during the evaluation.

Single-choice / Multiple-choice templates

A stored template will be inserted when this option is selected.

 The stored objects can be moved and positioned at will via drag & drop. Needless to say, other objects (arrows, frames, text etc.) can also be stored in this step.

Separating several answers from one another on a page

Answers can be separated from one another by assigning one or more answer units to different **groups**. You can then define a common correct answer for each respective group.

Choose any group for the selected answer and then assign all other answers to the same group which you want to mark as being connected. The answers in group 1 are then separated from the answers in group 2.

The group to which an answer is to belong can be specified via the **Edit properties** option in the context menu, or via the **properties** in the list of **presentation objects**.
