

# Publishing training material

This documentation shows how and where you can publish training material.

There are various ways of making training material available to your users.

#### **Publishing via the portal (WebAccess)**

tts performance suite provides a **portal**, known as the **WebAccess**, via which learners and end users can access released processes, topics or courses and their associated documents. Assuming you have the appropriate authorizations, you therefore have a direct view of all content. Access via mobile devices is also possible.

The portal is fully integrated into tts performance suite, meaning that content can be directly released for the portal.

## **Publishing via QuickAccess**

tts performance suite provides an online help known as **QuickAccess**. QuickAccess uses the portal to find and display the help documents involving a particular application.

QuickAccess is fully integrated into tts performance suite via the portal, meaning that content can be directly released for QuickAccess.

## **Export for LMS (Learning Management System)**

You can export processes, topics or courses as a continuous WBT and integrate them into your LMS (**WBT export**). In addition to a WBT export, you also have the option of exporting an individual Producer document for import into an LMS (**LMS package**). Both the WBT export and the LMS package contain all relevant data for AICC and SCORM communication.

In the event that your authors use tts performance suite to change the training material following the export, you would then need to carry out a new export.

## Linking in an LMS or other portals

The portal in tts performance suite supports **portal links**. These can be used in third-party systems to facilitate the direct accessing of individual documents, along with processes, topics or courses.

## **Export for use in third-party systems or other portals**

If you want to access WBTs or individual documents via a link from a third-party system or a different portal, it's possible to export them and store them on a web server. Both the **WBT export** (from a process, topic or course) and **individual export** (from a Producer document) contain the appropriate start files. These can then be accessed from the third-party system or portal via a URL.
