

Properties of a step

This documentation explains the properties of a step that can be changed via the Properties dialog.

1 Properties of a step

Various settings can be defined for a step, which is also often called a page in an e-learning. The properties can be opened by double-clicking a step in the Step list or via the **Properties** option in the context menu.

Please note: The **Edit properties** entry in the context menu opens the tabular view of all properties. The tabular view includes more properties than in the Properties dialog. The tabular view allows you to edit several selected steps simultaneously.

Properties

- Title: The title of the step should be entered into this input field.
- E-learning modes: The e-learning mode defines whether a page in the e-learning is to be available to the user in the Study mode or Assessment mode, or in both modes

simultaneously.

- Individual Play mode: The document properties specify the Play mode in which a Producer document is to be viewed. 3 modes – *Interactive*, *Presentation* and *Film* – are possible. It's possible to change the mode specified for the entire document for a particular individual page.
- Hide step in site map: This option hides the page in the site map. This only applies to the HTML Player and to the site map integrated into the HTML Player.

Visibility

The "Visibility" section is for defining the exports in which the page is to be visible to the user. Three options are supported – *E-learning*, *Documentation* and *Guide*.

Tutorial control

These settings only apply to the HTML Player and to the tutorial control that is integrated into the HTML Player.

- Tutorial control: You can either show or hide the tutorial control. If the tutorial control is to be displayed, it's possible to modify its position.
- Proceed only via Next button: You can specify that the user can only proceed to the next page via the Continue button. If this option is activated, the user won't be able to move on to the next page by simply clicking the current page.
Please note: If this option is activated, this also impacts on the HTML5 Player.
Proceed only via Next button suppresses the option that allows the user to move on to the next page with a swipe (gesture on mobile devices).
- Disable Back button: It's possible to deactivate the Back button for a particular step in order to prevent the user from switching back to the page that was last displayed.
- Position of tutorial control: If the tutorial control is to be displayed, it's possible to modify its position. You can use either the default positions or position the tutorial control with pinpoint pixel accuracy (option: Absolute position). If this option is selected, it's possible to define the X or Y position and the width of the tutorial control.
